- The curriculum requirements for at least one endorsement

Performance Acknowledgement may be earned upon completion of the Distinguished Level of Achievement and for an outstanding performance in the following areas:

- Dual Credit Courses
- Bilingualism and Biliteracy
- AP Exams
- PSAT, ACT, or SAT
- Earning a nationally or internationally recognized business or industry certification or license

TRANSFER STUDENTS: Students who transfer into SEISD during their Junior or Senior years with insufficient time to complete credits for the Distinguish Level of Achievement diploma may graduate under the Texas Foundation Plan.
