A student may earn a Multidisciplinary Studies Endorsement by completing foundation and general endorsement requirements including and:

- A. Four advanced courses that prepare a student to enter the workforce successfully or postsecondary education without remediation from within one endorsement – or
- B. Four credits in each of the four foundation subject areas to include English IV and Chemistry and/or Physics – or
- C. Four credits in Advanced Placement (AP), or Dual Credit (DC) selected from English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Economics, Languages other than English (LOTE), or Fine Arts.

San Elizaro offers an eight period day which allows students the opportunity to earn thirty-two credits over their four-year high school career. The listed courses only take into account the courses needed to satisfy the San Elizaro Distinguished Endorsement Plan.

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
